



# Summer rates are here.

Remember, peak hours are 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., weekdays, when electricity use is the highest and it costs the most to get it to you. That means electricity rates are lower the other 21 hours of the day during the week, as well as all hours on weekends and holidays.

From June 1 through September 30, you'll pay less for electricity when you shift your usage to mid-peak and off-peak hours.

Shifting some of your electricity usage to times when it costs less can help you manage your summer electricity bills.
